Aotearoa is set to celebrate the first Matariki public holiday on Friday, June 24. Matariki refers to the star cluster also known as Pleiades, which disappears from view at the beginning of the cold months. When the stars reappear in the pre-dawn sky in the middle of winter, it signals the Māori New Year.
